

## Leonardo at the top in anti-corruption. **“Anti-bribery Management Systems”** certification confirmed

- Leonardo has been re-certified as compliant with the ISO 37001:2016 standard, recognising the Company’s commitment to anti-corruption, its targeted risk assessment, stringent internal controls and awareness-raising campaigns
- Leonardo recently ranked first in the *Defence Companies Index on Anti-Corruption and Corporate Transparency of Transparency International*

**Rome, 28 July 2021** – Leonardo has been confirmed as a leader in anti-corruption practices. The company has again been recognised by RINA, an independent certification body accredited with Accredia (National Accreditation Body of certification and inspection bodies) and the Italian leader in conformity assessment, with the ISO 37001:2016 “*Anti-bribery Management System*” certification - the first international standard on anti-corruption management systems.

Leonardo was first certified compliant in 2018 when it became one of the first companies in the aerospace, defence and security sector at an international level to obtain the certification. This year’s renewal recognises Leonardo’s continued commitment to anti-corruption as a priority issue, with a strong focus on responsible business management in line with sector best practices. The Company continues to strengthen its risk management and internal controls system in order to prevent, detect and combat corruption.

*“The renewal of this certification demonstrates how anti-corruption is rooted within our business practices,”* said **Luciano Carta, Leonardo’s Chairman**. *“Our system of rules is based on the principles of integrity and transparency. We have implemented them to reduce the risk of illegal practice at all levels of the business and across geographies. It is a robust approach to responsible business management that we commit energy and resources to every day. We have a zero tolerance approach towards corruption which is underpinned by continuous employee training and specific risk prevention strategies.”*

**Alessandro Profumo, Chief Executive Officer of Leonardo**, said *“Leonardo has adopted targeted risk-assessment methods and more stringent internal controls while delivering employee awareness campaigns on whistleblowing and anti-corruption issues. Our re-certification reflects the commitments to integrity, transparency and compliance that we have made over the years and the rules we have put in place to prevent and combat corruption, which is the result of the constant work of the numerous corporate functions involved.”*

Leonardo’s commitment to transparency, ethical business and anti-corruption recently saw the Company rank first place in the *Defence Companies Index on Anti-Corruption and Corporate Transparency (DCI)*, developed by the non-governmental organisation *Transparency International*.

Last year, Leonardo was also recognised for the second year running as the leading aerospace and defence company in the *Dow Jones Sustainability Indices*. The Company has also been included in climate change charity CDP’s *A-list* (formerly the Carbon Disclosure Project), is recognised by the United Nations as a *Global Compact LEAD* company and was included for the first time in the *Bloomberg Gender Equality Index (GEI)* in 2021.

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**Leonardo**, a global high-technology company, is among the top world players in Aerospace, Defence and Security and Italy’s main industrial company. Organized into five business divisions, Leonardo has a significant industrial presence in Italy, the United Kingdom, Poland and the USA, where it also operates through subsidiaries that include Leonardo DRS (defence electronics), and joint ventures and partnerships: ATR, MBDA, Telespazio, Thales Alenia Space and Avio. Leonardo competes in the most important international markets by leveraging its areas of technological and product leadership (Helicopters, Aircraft, Aerostructures, Electronics, Cyber Security and Space). Listed on the Milan Stock Exchange (LDO), in 2020 Leonardo recorded consolidated revenues of €13.4 billion and invested €1.6 billion in Research and Development. The company has been part of the Dow Jones Sustainability Index (DJSI) since 2010 and has been named as sustainability global leader in the Aerospace & Defence sector for the second year in a row of DJSI in 2020.
